
A letter from Ted Staunton







A note from Erin Bow:

My time in Mongolia is all over these pages: the goats and the milking, the water pails, the mountains, the smell of the dung fire, the summer weather, the Choco-Pies, the way the light seeps in around the doorframe of the ger at dawn. I even incorporated the bit from my diary where we had all the gers loaded into a truck, which was then intercepted by horsemen from a rival family. "It was like a scene from a movie," I wrote. "Specifically, it was like the scene from a movie where people are killed by Kazakh horsemen."

So this is a Mongolian story. But I hope it is also a universal story: about family, belonging, adventure, courage, and love.

Ultimately this is my story. I was that child who was loved but also cut adrift because I was the one not in crisis. I was that child spending endless hours with books of animal friendship and long days exploring the woods behind my house.

Because there is really a rising generation of Kazakh girls taking up the ancient art of eagle hunting, I'm often asked if this is one of their stories. It's not. But it's all true. And I made it all up. And that's fiction.
