What Equipment Does a Soldier Need?

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| 1) battledress | A) bottle opener |
| 2) wedge cap | B) medals and ribbons worn on a soldier's dress uniform |
| 3) frog | C) soldier's everyday khaki uniform |
| 4) shoulder titles | D) canned/tinned food, usually concentrated, that could be eaten when a soldier was on patrol or in battle |
| 5) shrapnel helmet | E) attachment to a soldier's belt to support a sword or bayonet |
| 6) pips | F) small case for needles, thread and other sewing equipment |
| 7) emergency rations | G) metallic tags soldiers wore showing their name and serial number |
| 8) buttons and bows | H) soldier's cooking and eating utensils |
| 9) housewife | I) small badges such as crowns and stars on the shoulder of an army officer's uniform, to indicate rank |
| 10) identity tags | J) belt with a shoulder strap running diagonally across the chest, worn as part of a military or police uniform |
| 11) mess tin/mess kit | K) badges worn on a uniform to indicate a battalion, regiment or corps |
| 12) church key | L) headgear to protect soldiers from shrapnel (soldiers sometimes detached the liner and used their helmets upside down to eat hot soup or stew) |
| 13) Sam Browne | M) fur-covered leather or sealskin pouch worn in front of a kilt |
| 14) webbing | N) woven material used to hold a soldier's gear |
| 15) sporran | O) V-shaped fabric cap |
